

BIBLIOGRAPHY: ONLINE SOURCES

Since much of your information and images will come from the internet, you must do these bibliographic entries properly. Follow these basic formats, which closely follow MLA style:

1. World Wide Web.

Author (if given). "Title." Date of document or download. <URL>.

(Examples)

Faber, David A. "How To Cite Internet Sources." 6 September 2005. <<http://www.edgartownscience.com>>.

"All About Diabetes." 19 December 2002. <<http://www.diabetes.org>>.

2. Online Images.

Author (if given). "Description or title of image." Date of document or download. <URL>.

(Examples)

"Human Eye Anatomy." 8 December 2005. <<http://www.micrographia.com>>.

Farley, John E. and Alice Smith. "Photosynthesis and Leaf Structure." 30 June 2004. <<http://www.emc.maricopa.edu>>.

3. E-mail.

Sender. "Subject Line From the E-mail." Date email posted. E-mail to recipients name. Date e-mail was accessed.

(Example)

Hyland, Anne. "Results." 2 January 2008. Email to John Johnson.
