### Special item not on the agenda:

### III. Finance Report

A. Vote to Recertify FY24 Budget – Shared Services Portion

There was a \$4,846.07 reduction in Shared Services over approximately 12 line items. The new budget for FY24 is \$10,582,533.87 which is a 6.7% increase in the total budget.

Kimberly Kirk made a motion to approve the revised budget and Louis Paciello seconded.

## IV. Superintendent's Report

### A. School Choice Vote for 2023-2024

Richie Smith asked the School Committee to affirm the Edgartown School staying in the School Choice Program. For FY23 DESE reports that Edgartown School is receiving 4 School Choice Students and sending 15 Students out of district.

Louis Paciello made a motion for Edgartown to remain in the School Choice Program and Laura Seguin seconded.

## C. Special Education Update - Hope MacLeod

### A. General Updates

The Outdoor Learning Campus Project has been split into two phases per the request of the town. Phase 1 of the outdoor campus project includes:

- Playground area for the older students
- Restoration of the field
- Outdoor Classroom

The new anticipated cost is \$980,000 which is below 1 million which is what the town requested of the school.
