I. Approval of Minutes from May 15, 2023

Louis Paciello made a motion to approve the Minutes from May 15, 2023, and Kelly Scott seconded. There was no discussion, comments or changes.

III. Finance Report - Mark Friedman reported.

A. End of Year Budget Transfers

IV. Superintendent's Report

A. General Update

Marge Harris and John Stevens have worked as interim assistant superintendents for 10 hours and 20 hours a week each respectively (and have exceeded those hours). Richie has asked John Stevens to stay on for next year which Mr. Stevens has agreed to. In the future Richie hopes that people in central office are being considered for new roles such as Kristen Lepine to take on some Human Resources roles such as hiring and Kim Garrison in an area of overseeing curriculum.

B. Non-Union Salaries

Dr. Smith gave out a chart regarding the combination of the step increases for the various units combined with the COLAs which average out to about a 5% increase.

Dr. Smith proposed a 5% increase for the three non-union workers at the Edgartown School: Dr. Shelley Einbinder, MaryAnn Bartlett, and Darren Belisle. There would be a need to find another \$2,500 to cover the costs of these increases. This would help keep the salaries in line with the COLA increases and steps.

There was discussion about the food services step levels.

Kelly Scott made a motion to accept the non-union salary recommendations and Louis Paciello seconded.
