## V. Finance Report

Fund balance report- no surprises - still good balance revolving lunch fund. Awaiting on state reimbursement

School choice fund healthy level- one more claim

Outdoor project- waiting for the closing of bids.

One thing we don't see is the new sped stabilization fund. We have been working with the town

General funds

Start at end and work back to beginning

This budget is lean

Right now projections show a negative balance of \$46,000. That is not where we are going to end up.

Working backwards from there the single largest reason is residential tuition. Unbudgetted residential placement.

That is what is causing the overall budget to look like it does.

If we look at all other lines, there are a few larger variances, most small. Salaries looking at transfers \$370,000. Projected overages substitutes. Custodians. Budget assumptions were not calculated properly.

Overtime related to injuries. That is what driving the salary line

Next meeting we will have line items

Administrative areas changes in the assumptions.

Kindergarten variances small

Teacher salary-Position budgeted vs working

Contractual savings assistants

Bumped up ELL translations- translating special education documents

Other contracted services- hired some folks as contractors not employees.

Text books-some savings

Purchased HMH for next year with this years title 1 monies

Advisor salaries-8th grade advisors we have 3

Technology-Use all funds for this year

Power and light- eversource having billing issues

General maintenance over a bit- this happens at all the schools- there was a regular schedule for painting and carpeting that fell apart in the last few years. We are reinstating that .

Small separation costs to pop up before the end of the year.

Residential tuition: Expenses

Stabilization fund: My recommendation is to use almost all and leave money in the account Remaining \$124,000 uses school choice money.

School committee and select board need to approve the budget.

Take vote for \$110,000.000 from SPED stabilization fund:

John requests to fill up the oil tank to have it in best condition for the summer in preparation for use

Scott: Should we assume the circuit breaker will be less than what we originally anticipated and should we budget for it.

Hope: July-we will know more. It will be ongoing instead of unanticipated. Generally 75% of our threshold.

Mark: circuit breaker vs extraordinary relief. Come out of different pools of money.

Scott: Want to be sure we are budgeting for changes in population. Don't want to be with our backs against the wall. How can we prepare ourselves for that as best we can.

On a motion duly made by Ms Scott and seconded by Ms Murphy and Ms Brown to use school choice funds to support special education residential placement line in the budget. 3 Ayes, 0 Nayes, 0 Abstentions

DESE reached out to staff to inform them that title 1 grants we need to restructure how we use them.

Grants come through our office. All grants going through office will not happen next year. Working with the towns. Will need to come to SC to "accept title 1 grant" Wil have to change the practice.-just informational.
